



KRONBERG PARK & MULTI-USE PATH

Located between Kellogg Lake and SE McLoughlin Boulevard, the Kronberg Park & Multi-Use Path will connect the Kellogg Creek Bike-Pedestrian Bridge and downtown Milwaukie area with the nearby sidewalk, crosswalk, and Trolley Trail at the south end of the park. It will also improve access to the Main Street light rail station.

This project will also restore and preserve existing habitat, install interpretive signs, create overlooks and bird blinds, and incorporate benches, picnic tables and a nature play area.

BUDGET

Construction of the park and multi-use path is funded through Milwaukie's Safe Access For Everyone (SAFE) charge, up to \$500,000, as well as a \$1.2 million Connect Oregon grant from ODOT.

Additionally, the city's Island Station Neighborhood District Association graciously donated \$5,000 to the project.
