NCPRD Master Plan

The project is being guided by a series of meetings with community leaders and stakeholders, along with contributions from residents, participants and NCPRD staff.

The new Master Plan will prioritize the community's needs and desires for upgrading existing facilities and services as well as creating new parks and facilities. It will also help to steer the phasing, timing and funding options for upcoming projects, programs and services.
