First I want to acknowledge and thank the NCPRD and DAC for their work in recognizing the ongoing need to increase the health of our parks. We had a wonderful mulching party at Alma Myra park last month.

Second, thank you for giving me the opportunity to address the DAC Wednesday evening. I mentioned a research study conducted by Washington State University, housed on ClackCo TV, that did a research study on the effectiveness of wood chip mulching vs glyphosate spraying for weed control in restoration projects and Fir Tree health. *Conclusive*!

Why or How? Wood chip Mulch feeds the microbiology (especially fungi) in the soil while pesticides/herbicides kill them. The benefits of healthy soil microbiology *or microbiome* are numerous. Infiltrating water, sequestering carbon, Building Soil Structure, nutrient cycling, lessening pest and disease pressure, *and what the study addressed*, more effective weed control! All making our parklands more resilient, healthy and functional.

There is no land on the planet that is lacking pesticides. What they are lacking is life. Let us add LIFE not death.
